**For Black History Month, Black CSUN Alum Gives Back with \$4,000 Scholarship to Students Alongside Jazz Legend Christian McBride Performance**

On Thursday Feb 2, 2023, CSUN's Black Alumni will celebrate both Jazz at Naz and a scholarship award. Dr. Shani Chen, a Caribbean native and CSUN Black Alumnus (2017 graduate) will award \$4,000 to two graduate students. As a former education leadership doctoral student, Chen fundraises money through her scholarship program dedicated to providing additional financial resources for BIPOC college students.

“It's so important to give back. For so many first generation students like myself, factoring the extra costs such as books and other living expenses are overlooked after paying tuition - going to college is expensive enough,” said Chen. This scholarship was inspired by her father's passing alongside supporting a Jamaican student, who was a double major, working two part-time jobs and struggling financially to buy books. “This student was doing her best but it wasn't enough and then it was an 'aha' moment to create this scholarship.” The student scholarship is in its fifth year and has raised over \$25,000 for 12 scholars.

As an educator and social entrepreneur, Chen works in the community as a career instructional coach at a local charter school and founded Educate U, a career & financial literacy training & mentoring program to positively impact students' lives. Her organization designs and implements programs for BIPOC youth to obtain sustainable careers in underrepresented industry sectors. In addition, she was a Linked Learning grant recipient from the James Irvine Foundation and continues to conduct research on career and technical education issues.

The Jazz at Naz is a month long celebration in honor of Black History Month celebrating music and culture. The evening will feature a live performance with “eight-time Grammy Award-winning bassist Christian McBride leading a Big Band and Gospel choir in an exuberant and powerful musical tribute to Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King, Jr., Muhammad Ali, Malcolm X, and Barack Obama—heroes of the Civil Rights movement,” according to the Soraya Performing Arts Center.


